RE	<p>Unit I – Easter. The children will explore the story of Easter through the story of Emmaus and the story of Breakfast at the Shore.</p> <p>Unit K - Pentecost The children will learn about the gift of the Holy Spirit and the change it brought to the lives of the Apostles. The children will work scientifically and collaboratively to investigate what plants need to grow well, and will present their findings to their classmates. They will work in a hands-on way to identify the parts of a flower, and will explore the different stages of the life cycle of a flowering plant.</p>
Computing	<p>Move It and Sort It.</p>	<p>Digital Literacy – How to keep safe when using a computer.</p>
Geography	<p>UK Identifying human and physical characteristics, key topographical features (including hills, mountains, coasts and rivers), and land-use patterns; and understand how some of these aspects have changed over time</p>	<p>Rainforest. In this Unit, children take a closer look at the mysteries of tropical rainforests. From the layers of the forest and its animal inhabitants, to the unique climate found in the tropics. They compare a British forest with the Amazon rainforest, and begin to explore some of the conservation issues surrounding the destruction of rainforest habitats.</p>
Art/DT	<p><u>Famous artists:</u> Explore studies of plants by Van Gogh eg: The Sunflowers, Monet – The Waterlilies. <u>Textiles:</u> Use of applique to create pictures of flowers.</p>	<p><u>Collage:</u> Use a variety of materials to create pictures (individual or group) of the rainforest. <u>Printing:</u> Roller/screen printing based on snake designs and other rain forest animals.</p>
